# Virtual Spring Event! Fire and Emergency Preparedness Q&A with CCC Fire and WCPD

Are you as prepared as you can be for wildfires and other emergencies? Our 2020 fire season was historic. At one point in August 2020 the 2nd and 3rd largest recorded wildfires in California history were approximately 35 miles north and 35 miles south of the Parkmead neighborhood, and smoke filled our skies. Do you know what to do if a wildfire starts in or near our neighborhood? How much fire risk is there in the Parkmead neighborhood? When and how should you evacuate? Where should you go? These are all questions many of us have, and we'll get some answers in a virtual Q&A. Since our neighborhood is partly unincorporated, we'll have both the Contra Costa County Fire Protection District and the Walnut Creek Police Department join us. We are working to confirm the exact date and time keep your eyes and ears open for more information about when and how to access this virtual event.

## Meet Lena Schorkopf, PCA Vice President and scholarship recipient

Lena Schorkopf served on the PCA board as our high school liaison for two years. She was very active in planning and decision making, and was elected PCA Vice President for 2021. In April 2020, the PCA presented Lena with a \$500 scholarship in recognition of her exemplary service to our community. Lena is finishing her first year at UCLA as a Political Science Major, remote learning from her home in Parkmead. Board Secretary Kristen McLeran recently had the opportunity to talk with Lena. Below is a small part of their conversation.

**Kristen:** Are there any experiences or insights that stand out from your time on the board?

**<u>Lena:</u>** It was interesting to see all that goes into an event or activity. I participated with my family in these events before I joined the board, but I had no idea how much work is involved.

As a board member, I participated in planning, budgeting, and organizing. It was great to see the fruits of our labor on the day of the event and how we brought people together. Even if only a small group participated, it was a new opportunity to meet neighbors.

I am interested in political science and it was interesting to see that even a small, informal organization like a neighborhood community group has by-laws and bureaucratic structure determining how meetings are run.

**Kristen:** Your first year as a college student is different from what you expected, since you have been learning and living at home. Can you describe your experiences with your new remote college community?

**<u>Lena:</u>** I definitely felt a part of the school and valued as a student. The ease with which I could meet my professors during their online office

hours was terrific. I successfully connected with professors even when I was one of 300 students in a large lecture class.

On the other hand, I did not really find a social community. It was hard to make long lasting connections with new friends without being together in person. It is even hard to connect with students in the small groups that are organized for classes.

Since I was living at home I saved money on room and board, but I still had to pay for tuition, various student fees and textbooks. The PCA scholarship helped me with those expenses.

**Kristen:** Do you have any closing thoughts to add?

**Lena:** I would like to recommend joining the PCA to high school students who are interested in getting involved with the neighborhood on a very personal level. Being on the board is unique because you are giving back directly to your own community, something that can be difficult with a larger organization.
